CLUB TERM AND CONDITIONS

Terms &
Conditions

1. There will be 10 weeks of activities in each term.
2. Parents/carers should book only once per child.
Simultaneous bookings may not be refunded.
3. Each club is filled at the beginning of each term, places will not be held from term to term except peripatetic lessons and karate.
4. There are a limited number of club spaces. Please be aware that not all children will obtain the club of preference. A waiting list will help manage preferences in future terms.
5. The club places are only confirmed once payment is received at the time of the booking.
6. Children and families who qualify for pupil premium status will be offered **one club** each term at 10% of the total cost of the club; the school covering the remaining 90%.
7. Clubs require a term's commitment and the fees are not refundable if your child drops out of the club.
8. No refund can be given for missed extra-curricular activities including peripatetic music lessons except if cancelled by the school or tutor.
9. Any changes or cancellations of booked extra-curricular activities including peripatetic lessons will be subject to a 10% processing fee to cover financial and administration costs.
10. Please notify the club leader (via the office) if your child will not be attending the club if they attend school on that day.
11. Parents will be notified if a club is cancelled as soon as we become aware. We will aim to give as much notice as possible via email.
12. Children attending activities are expected to behave appropriately and follow our school rules and code of conduct.

USING ARBOR TO SIGN UP FOR CLUBS

To sign up for clubs please follow the steps below.

Your user name is the email address the school has on file for you. If you cannot remember your password there is a **Forgotten password** link in green directly under the enter password box on the signing in screen.

First Time Users

For those using Arbor for the first time you will see a link called **First time logging in?**. You will be asked to agree to Arbor's terms & conditions. A verification box will then pop up asking you to input your child's date of birth. You can then follow the steps outlined below.

Once you are in the main Arbor screen on the Arbor app scroll down to activities and select Clubs. All clubs your child is eligible for will be listed there.

Select the club you wish to sign your child up for.

Select Register your child for this club

Click on Choose a membership option (there will be only one) and select it and then click next.

Select Membership Period, then press Apply. At this stage if you see a blank screen this is an indication that the club is fully booked and you will not be able to proceed.

Tick the box under Review Membership Dates and proceed to make a payment.

Please note the following points:

- When you log on, the system will display only your own child/ren
- If you have more than one child, you need to select each child individually to sign them up for clubs

PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING



Children who receive pupil premium funding pay 10% of the total cost of a club. This offer is for one child per club, per term.

COLLECTION/DROP OFF ARRANGEMENT

After-school clubs:

Children in Reception to year 3 will be taken from their class room to the club room by an adult at the end of school day.

Children in Years 4-6 will be notified which room their club is held in and are expected to make their way on their own at the end of school day.

Should a parent be collecting their child/children as a late collection, this should be done via the school office.

Before-school clubs:

Meeting point for clubs which start at 8am is the Atrium at the school office.

We ask that parents stay with their children until they are collected by the tutor.

Mindful Chess is an extra-curricular club designed to get children excited about developing their chess and concentration skills. We teach students from those starting to learn the game, to students now competing at national level. We take a dynamic approach to learning the beautiful game. We look to tailor our sessions to best serve each individual student within the class.

Our sessions include: Tactical Training Exercises, Games with Chess Clocks, Lateral Thinking Puzzles, Giant Team Chess & Chess Competitions.

Our approach to teaching was inspired by our work with Hong Kong's most prestigious chess school Scholastic Chess. Our aim is to build students capabilities and confidence in an environment which is supportive, inspiring and fun. As well as developing students chess skills we look to equip them with concentration techniques to apply to both their chess and other studies.

We also provide each student with their own Chess Kid account. This means as well as having access to further training exercises and video tutorials, they can play against other students online anywhere in the world in a totally safe environment.

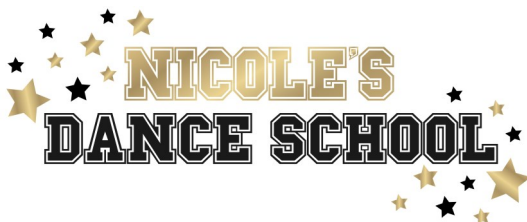

DUNGEONS AND DRAGONS

This will be an introduction to the classic Role Playing Game (aka RPG), **Dungeons & Dragons** (aka D&D) for Years 4-6 with Peter Worley (aka 'the philosophy man' in the school for the past 15 years!). It will be 'rules light' yet storytelling focussed, and I will introduce any rules step-by-step and in an easy to understand way. 'Players' - as the attendees will be called - assume an alter ego, that they

will create, and become a character, maybe a fighter, thief or magic user. They will decide what the character does in a world that I, the referee (aka 'Dungeon Master'), will present and describe to them. It will be like being inside their own movie or video game where they must work together (most of the time!) to solve problems, fight monsters and embark on quests using their wits, spells and equipment and, of course, dice, to determine uncertain outcomes. Will they dare to enter the dungeon where anything can happen?! If they do dare, then they should come to see me **after school on Mondays 3:20-4:20pm**, but whether they come out alive at the end will be up to them... and the DICE!

D&D, as well as being a lot of fun, is good for developing imagination, mental arithmetic, problem solving and team work. Parents should be made aware that they will be involved in story-games that include killing monsters, using magic, mildly scary stories and the possibility of their own characters dying. That said, my style of play is imbued with more philosophy, storytelling, character development and moral thinking than you might ordinarily get when playing D&D, to help encourage social and moral development.

Thought Adventures will be run by **Peter Worley**, the philosophy man in John Ball School for the past 15 + years and world renowned author of many books doing philosophy with children including *The If Machine*.

The children will be taken into stories and scenarios that get them thinking whilst having fun. They will draw, play games, hear stories and be activated as moral and intellectual thinkers as the questions, dilemmas and problems in the stories are handed over to them to consider and possibly resolve. This club will help them develop their creative, critical and collaborative reasoning, their critical engagement with stories, ideas, each other and even themselves! It can also help with the development of empathy, listening, understanding, speaking and articulation skills - all while having fun as a **community of enquiry**! They will think about such things as personal identity (what makes you who you are?), time (Can you travel into the future?), ethics (what would/should you do with a ring of invisibility?), metaphysics (what would it be like to keep shrinking and never stop?), epistemology (How do you know if a lie is a lie?) and many, many more child-friendly philosophical re-packages for young children

The Family Baking Club is a bi-weekly enrichment program designed to bring children and parent/carer together through creative, hands-on baking. Each 75-minute session introduces a new baking technique, allowing participants to explore a variety of recipes while building confidence, independence, and enjoyment in the kitchen within a relaxed and supportive environment.



Across the term, families will create items such as cookies, surprise biscuits, tartelettes, fast breads, bento cakes, Tarte Tatin, and choux au craquelin. Every session results in baked goods to take home, encouraging pride, conversation, and shared enjoyment beyond the club.

All ingredients and equipment are provided, ensuring the club is accessible while offering a high-quality creative experience for families participating. Recipes can be adapted where possible to support allergens and dietary requirements, helping ensure that participants feel included and able to take part safely.
